Make ramps using books resting on tins etc. at different gradients. Roll a ball or a car down each slope and talk about how fast or far each goes. Why do some go faster than others? Learning Focus – Vocabulary		8. Listen to a story online with someone else and discuss what you liked, what you didn't like and anything the story reminded you of. Learning Focus – Listening Talking Comprehension
9. Play 'I spy with my little eye, something beginning with(use the sounds, not the letter names) Or Play 'I hear with my little ear, something beginning with <b>Learning Focus</b> – listening and sounds in words	10. Play 1, 2, 3 - A Fun Game for Me Think of a Word - <b>Lolly</b> Think of a word that starts with same sound - <b>lemon</b> Think of a word that rhymes with it - <b>dolly</b> Say the word and clap the syllables (beats) – Lo-lly – 2 beats		11. Make a maze for a teddy bear in the house. Talk about directions and positional language e.g. left, right, backwards, forwards, under, over, beside, underneath <b>Learning Focus</b> – Vocabulary		<ul> <li>12.
