# **Learning Teams**

This session we are running new 'Learning Teams' which will take place on a Friday afternoon. This will replace Golden Time and pupils are currently discussing suggested activities with their class teachers. These include football, outdoor play, fitness, art and chess. Children will be able to sign up for their preferred club once they have collected 10 dojo points, and will mix with children from other classes to complete their team activity (Primary 1, 2/1 and 2 will join together, Primary 3, 4/3 and 4 will join together and Primary 5, 5/6, 6 and 7 will join together). Teaching and support staff will supervise the activities which will link to various curricular areas and to skills for Learning, Life and Work. #### Health and Safety

- Due to an increasing number of children with nut related allergies we kindly ask that nuts and nut related products (eg peanut butter/Nutella) are not included in lunch boxes as snacks.
- Please do not use the school car park or the zig zag lines in front of the school as a drop off
  point. This is to ensure all pupils can enter the playground safely at the start and end of the
  school day. We will be working with our Junior Road Safety Officers and our community
  policeman Stewart Kerrigan to encourage safe parking and drop offs around our school.
- If your child is going to be late or absent from school due to illness or to attend an
  appointment, we kindly ask that you notify the school office before 9am. We have a duty of
  care to all pupils which means if parents don't notify us and we can't contact you, we have to
  inform the attendance officer who may visit to ensure children are safe. We also ask that if
